Dr Michael Lim is an internationally renowned Cardiologist with vast experience in CT Coronary Angiography and Interventional Cardiology. He published the first paper in Asia to show a high level of diagnostic accuracy and safety of CT coronary angiography using his protocols (Clinical Radiology, 2006 ; European Society of Cardiology, 2008). Dr Lim will speak on **Preventing Sudden Death** .

Abstract : The commonest cause of sudden death in most adults is heart attack. It is commonly believed that breathing difficulties or chest pains precede a heart attack but in reality, there are often no such warning signs. Chest pains may occur when more than 70% of the lumen of your heart artery is clogged up. However, studies have shown that the majority of heart attack patients have only a minor narrowing of their arteries (between 40% and 60%) and do not feel any chest pains. Advances in medical technology have enabled doctors to identify those who may be at risk of developing heart attacks. These advances have also made it easier and safer for patients with severe disease of their heart arteries to be treated safely with excellent outcomes. This talk will enable you to understand how these medical advances can help you prevent sudden death and you will also have an opportunity to gain an understanding on the latest in the management of heart disease.
